- Who may attend:** Scouts (all ages and ranks, with advance registration) and adults.

- Meet at:** Friday May 16 at 5:30 PM at the VA parking lot. Have an early dinner at home, and bring a snack for the car.
- Dress:** Class A uniform shirts & troop hats while traveling. This is a New England late spring camping trip, so be prepared for cold weather, warm weather, and rainy weather! Check your handbook, and pack sensibly. This is a backpacking trip, hiking boots are necessary. Younger scouts need day packs, and older scouts need overnight backpacks. If you don't have one, they can be rented, but you need to see Mr. Skorupka ahead of time). You may bring a personal supply of appropriate trail snacks (trail mix, bars, etc),but do NOT bring candy.
- Est. Return Time:** Sunday, May 18th, approximately 3:00 PM. Scouts will be driven home.
- Permission slip due:** Signed permission slip due at the troop meeting April 29, 2008
- Event Cost:** \$50 Due at Troop Meeting, April 29, 2008.
- Food Cost:** Included in Event Cost.
- In your pocket:** Scouts may want to have spending money available to purchase snacks on the ride home.
